(Physical Exam & Developmental Assessment – AAP & IDPH Vaccine Recommendations)

Birth – 18 Years Immunization & Visit Schedule

Age	Visit Details
Birth	HepB
1 Month	None
2 Months	Vaxelis (DTaP, IPV, Hib, HepB), Pneumococcal, Rotavirus
4 Months	Vaxelis (DTaP, IPV, Hib, HepB), Pneumococcal, Rotavirus
6 Months	Vaxelis (DTaP, IPV, Hib, HepB), Pneumococcal, Rotavirus
9 Months	None
12 Months	Pneumococcal, MMR, HepA #1, Hemoglobin
15 Months	Varicella, Pentacel (DTaP, IPV, Hib)
18 Months	HepA #2
2 Years	No vaccines if up to date
2 1/2 Years	No vaccines if up to date
4 Years	DTaP & IPV (Quadracel); MMR & Varicella (ProQuad)
11 Years	Tdap, Meningococcal ACWY, HPV9
12–15 Years	HPV9 series (if not started or completed)
16 Years	Meningococcal ACWY #2, HPV9 (if not started or completed)
17–18 Years	Meningococcal B, HPV9 (if not started or completed)

3 Years & Older

✓ Physical exams yearly

State of Illinois School Physical Requirements

The State of Illinois requires school physicals for children entering:

- **Kindergarten** – Exam + immunizations completed at 4 years old
 - **6th Grade** – Exam + Tdap + Meningococcal ACWY
 - **9th Grade** – Exam
 - **7th Grade through 12th Grade**- yearly sports exam if participating in school sports
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Seasonal & Recommended Vaccines

- **Influenza Vaccine** – Highly recommended for children 6 months and older
(August through April)
 - **COVID-19 Vaccine** – Highly recommended for children 6 months and older
 - **RSV Immunization**-Highly recommended for infants 8 months and younger
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Available Individual Vaccines

We can administer the following as individual (non-combination) vaccines: DTap, IPV, Hib, HepB, MMR, and Varicella

Please Note:

- DTaP **cannot** be separated into individual diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis vaccines.
 - MMR **cannot** be separated into individual measles, mumps, and rubella vaccines.
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Immunization Abbreviations & Descriptions

Abbreviation	Vaccine
DTaP	Diphtheria / Tetanus / Acellular Pertussis
Tdap	Tetanus / Diphtheria / Acellular Pertussis
Hib	Haemophilus influenzae type B
IPV	Inactivated Polio Vaccine
MMR	Measles / Mumps / Rubella
HepB	Hepatitis B
HepA	Hepatitis A
HPV9	Human Papillomavirus (Gardasil 9)
